IF YOUR PET ATE SOMETHING — THE FIRST MINUTES

- 1 Move your pet away** from the substance, and pick up what's left so no one eats more.
- 2 Grab the package or wrapper** — the label (ingredients, cocoa %, "sugar-free") is what the hotline works from.
- 3 Note what, how much, and when** — your best guess, estimating high. Fill in the blanks below while you dial.
- 4 Call — do not wait for signs** and do NOT induce vomiting unless a veterinary professional tells you to. Signs of many poisons take hours to appear.

- **Chocolate** — dark, baking & cocoa powder are worst
- **Xylitol / birch sugar** — "sugar-free" gum, candy, some peanut butters
- **Grapes, raisins & currants** — even a few
- **Onion, garlic, leek & chives** — fresh, cooked or powdered
- **Macadamia nuts**
- **Alcohol & raw yeast dough**
- **Marijuana / THC edibles**
- **Moldy food & compost**

Tip — Print one for the fridge and one for the pet sitter, and fill in the numbers today. Check any food in seconds at newdogco.com/dog-toxic-foods-checker — and if it was chocolate, the chocolate calculator at newdogco.com/dog-chocolate-calculator estimates the severity while you dial.
